Streaking Grove City wins district title

Grove City has defeated teams with its legs, arms and bats in winning 20 straight games on the way to a third Division I district baseball championship in four seasons.

Coach Ryan Alexander has called the season crazy for a team that lost five of its first eight games. The Greyhounds had more magic yesterday as right-hander Chase Antle threw a two-hitter and the bats awakened in the bottom of the sixth in a 3-0 victory over Westerville Central at Ohio Dominican.

The victory kept Grove City (23-5) in the hunt to make a third state tournament in four seasons.

"The dog pile at the end of games, we live for that," Alexander said of the players forming a small mountain of bodies on the infield to celebrate a victory. "We talk about the dog pile all the time."

The players tested Alexander's patience time and again against Westerville Central (24-4). Poor base running wasted two hits in the first inning. The bases were left loaded in the third. And two more runners were left on base in the fourth.

The persistence paid dividends in the sixth, when Robbie Jobe led off by beating out a grounder to deep short, stole second and moved to third on Dakota Hawkins' single to right.

Westerville Central lefthander Austin Sherry relieved starter Kyle Keifer and struck out Gage Kavy. The third strike was in the dirt, though, and the catcher threw wildly to first base, allowing Jobe to score.

Jake Faught followed by hitting a 2-and-2 fastball to center to drive in two runs.

"That hit was a big relief because the last time at bat, I struck out," Faught said. "I had a better approach. I fought off a few pitches. Basically, I was thinking middle or back side."

Faught smiled and said, "We're piling up hard wins. This is crazy, a big accomplishment." None of it would have been possible had Antle not struck out five and walked two.

Antle also got the victory against Darby in a district semifinal by throwing 28 pitches in relief.

"I have a lot more pitches in me," Antle said. "I'm not done. I just had faith in my team. We've been battling all season. I had a lot of confidence in myself. I definitely had confidence in my fastball. But I just wanted to keep the team in the game."

Chase Antle pitched a two-hitter and the Grove City High School baseball team scored three runs in the sixth inning on its way to a 3-0 win over Westerville Central in a Division I district final May 22 at Ohio Dominican University.

The Greyhounds, who have won 20 consecutive games, improved to 23-5 and will play Gahanna in a regional semifinal Thursday, May 29, at Dublin Coffman.

It is Grove City's third district title in the past four seasons.

Antle and Central's Nick Buchanan hooked up in a pitchers' duel before Grove City broke through in the sixth.

Robbie Jobe reached on an infield single, stole second and moved to third on Dakota Hawkins' single.

Jobe scored the eventual winning run when Blake Griffith struck out against reliever Austin Sherry, but reached first on Central catcher Austin Kondratick's throwing error to first on strike three in the dirt.

Grove City ousted by Gahanna in regional

Trailing Gahanna 8-3 heading into the bottom of the seventh inning in a Division I regional semifinal May 29 at Dublin Coffman, the Grove City High School baseball team's final rally of the season fell short.

The Greyhounds scored four runs and had the tying and winning runs on base before losing 8-7.

The loss snapped a 21-game winning streak, as Grove City finished 24-6 overall.

"I love this group of guys," coach Ryan Alexander said. "It's going to be tough not to wake up and go to work with them again tomorrow."

Grove City won the two meetings with Gahanna in OCC-Ohio Division play, 5-3 on May 1 and 3-2 on May 3.

The Lions rallied from a 3-1 deficit in the third meeting, scoring three runs in the third to take the lead for good.

Trailing 8-3, Grove City used a two-run double from Tyler Cowles, an RBI double from Ben Myers and an RBI single from Robbie Jobe to pull within a run.

Mason Daniels then pitched out of the jam to preserve the win for Gahanna.

The Greyhounds hit into three double plays.

"We haven't played like this in a long time," Alexander said. "I don't know how many routine plays we did not make. Our pitching has been awesome and our defense has been awesome lately and neither of them came to play (May 29)."

Evan White singled twice. tripled, doubled and drove in three runs for Gahanna, which beat Olentangy Liberty 8-4 on May 30 at Coffman to reach OCC-Ohio Division title at 12the state tournament.
